ASCA is enabled by three programs which support a comprehensive and connected delivery system that is explicitly linked to an acquisition pathway.





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ASCA Missions



- Missions are driven by problem statements, aligned to Defence priorities and approved by Vice Chief of Defence Force (VCDF).
- Mission program leaders will be fixed term appointments, drawn from across the ecosystem.
- Missions are typically time-limited to 3 years, with clear performance targets and off-ramps.
- Missions will not commence without an endorsed pathway to acquisition.



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ASCA Missions

Mission 1 Problem Statements



On 1 November 2023, ASCA released its first two Problem Statements aligned to Defence's strategic priorities:



Problem Statement 1

How might we penetrate and degrade advanced integrated air defence systems so that Defence can conduct effective long-range strike operations, taking into account speed and scale required to operate in congested and contested environments that is faster than a potential adversary's ability to react?



Problem Statement 2

How might we improve the processing and synthesis of large amounts of intelligence data to support the planning and apportionment of platforms, taking into account different classification levels of data, systems and allies data systems?

On the 8 December, ASCA commenced recruitment for the first Mission Leader – an innovative individual to lead an agile team, to deliver priority capability solutions for Defence.

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Mission Approach



To deliver its first Mission, ASCA's will undertake two activities:



MISSION CO-DESIGN

(8-week period with optional 4-week extension)

Successful respondents will design and scope, in collaboration with Defence key stakeholders and other Participants, the delivery methodology and approach to execute and implement a solution to a Problem Statement.

An evaluation of the deliverables submitted in co-design will be undertaken and successful respondents may be invited to participate in Mission Delivery.

ASCA is expecting respondents to respond explicitly to **co-design ONLY**

MISSION DELIVERY

(up to a three-year period)

Will consist of delivering a **Minimum Viable Capability** of the proposed innovation / technology solution in accordance with the Project Execution Plan delivered in co-design.


